Aims & Scope of the Conference

The 2nd Global Conference on Regional Development 2023 will be devoted to the theme: “*Uncertainty in Regional Development: Shocks and Resilience - Innovative Strategies of Regions and Cities*”. The idea behind this conference is that regions are increasingly an arena of far-reaching changes, as is witnessed by financial economic crises, natural disasters, pandemics, geopolitical conflicts and climate change. Such changes impact on sustainability, prosperity and wellbeing in all regions of the world. Global uncertainties and disruptions (e.g., recession, climate change, pandemics) challenge the governance capacity of nations, regions and metropolitan areas. A central concept in the current debate is resilience; this concept covers the chain of: shocks, impacts on spatial systems, recovery measures, and the emergence of new regional and urban equilibria, in both the developed world and emerging economies. At the same time, regions and metropolitan areas provide effective platforms to design and shape a new world consistent with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. This conference brings together renowned experts and scholars from all over the world in order to share and combine knowledge and insights, so as to develop new theoretical and policy frameworks that may act as a reference for pioneering developments, innovative and sustainable trajectories and higher quality of life conditions in all regions and cities around the world.

The aims of this conference are:

- to mobilize and foster new knowledge on the complexity of the current space-economy from a global-to-local perspective, through the exploration of novel scientific insights on the long-run responses to major disruptions (e.g. pandemics, disasters) in order to achieve a balanced regional and urban development path.
- to enhance international capacity building on the above mentioned pressing issues through virtual and physical interactions among experts all over the world.

Relevant Topics of the Conference

Economic history tells us that regional and urban growth does not show a rectilinear balanced development. There are periods of accelerated growth, but also periods of decline and slow recovery. Such dynamic patterns are usually different for cities and regions in our world, even inside the same country. This dynamic and often fluctuating trajectory calls for new scientific endeavours and novel research, in particular on:

- The determinants of decline/growth or shocks in a spatial system, such as:
 - new technological developments
 - demographic development
 - pandemics
 - geographical governance disruptions
 - natural and climatological events, etc.
- The assessment of the effects of regional shocks, such as:
 - impacts on labour markets
 - effects on business life
 - mobility, transport and tourism
 - long-run regional and urban developments
 - sustainability effects, etc.
- The analysis of regional policy measures, for instance:
 - digital technology measures
 - leadership initiatives
 - environmental sustainability measures
 - cooperation and integration of regional measures
 - impacts of creative classes
 - spatial labour and housing market policies, etc.
